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Pittsburgh Opera Announces 2009-2010 Season: Discover Yourself

Pittsburgh, PA... [Pittsburgh Opera](#) announces its [2009-2010 season](#), "Discover Yourself", opening September 26 at the Benedum Center. The season focuses on masterpieces of the literary and theater worlds, from Beaumarchais's once-banned *Le Mariage de Figaro* to Pushkin's "novel in verse," *Eugene Onegin*, to Shakespeare's *The Merry Wives of Windsor* and *Lucrece*. The operas on the 2009-2010 mainstage will be Tchaikovsky's *Eugene Onegin*, Verdi's *Falstaff*, Bizet's *Carmen* and Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*. Britten's *The Rape of Lucretia* will be performed by the Resident Artists at CAPA Theater.

[General Director Christopher Hahn](#) believes the Pittsburgh Opera audiences will be pleased with the variety of offerings and artists on the season: "I am proud that we are able to offer such wonderful productions and casts, in the current environment. We have worked very hard to make sure we continue to present a superb artistic product, while making a real effort to keep opera as accessible as possible, with our new lowest ticket price at \$10, and our new lowest subscription price at \$42."

Pittsburgh Opera's [Music Director Antony Walker](#), who conducts three mainstage operas in the 2009-2010 season, says, "It is no wonder that we often return to the masterpieces for inspiration – they always have something new to teach us in the context of our daily lives and, because they continue to inspire, they also give us hope for the future."

New Year's Eve 2009 presents an opportunity for Pittsburgh Opera to fill a void in the social calendar – the need for an extraordinary event on what should be a truly romantic night of

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the year. Pittsburgh Opera will offer *Auld Lang Syne*, an evening in three parts: elegant dinner, concert and party, all at Carnegie Music Hall in Oakland. Western Pennsylvania native, Pittsburgh Opera favorite, and Duquesne University alumna, mezzo-soprano Marianne Cornetti will give an unforgettable concert with orchestra, coupled with candlelight dinner and dancing, for a classic New Year's Eve experience. Pittsburgh Opera's Resident Artists join the concert, and Pittsburgh Opera Music Director Antony Walker conducts. More details will be announced in July 2009.

The company also plans to launch its new website on February 16, which includes significant improvements in functionality and aesthetics. In process since summer 2008, the website will include an interactive calendar, an enhanced ticketing interface, slide-show capability, and a content management program for convenient in-house updates and additions. Flexibility is a huge asset with the new website, which is capable of hosting audio/video clips and gives the company many new options to facilitate the perception of opera as the three-dimensional art form it truly is. The company's public relations and marketing efforts will also incorporate more website use.

2009-2010 Season Highlights

September 26 – October 4, 2009: Tchaikovsky's *Eugene Onegin*, showcasing the ravishing soprano Anna Samuil as Tatiana, Metropolitan Opera baritone Dwayne Croft in the title role, Susanne Mentzer as Madame Larina, and Pittsburghers Raymond Very (as the poet Lensky) and Susan Shafer (as Filipyevna) in a stylish production from Vancouver Opera. Music Director Antony Walker conducts this elegant evocation of love and class differences in Czarist Russia; Sam Helfrich (2005 *The Turn of the Screw*) directs.

September 26, 2009: Opening Night will showcase the 55th annual [Diamond Horseshoe Celebration](#). Details will be announced at a later date.

October 24 – November 1, 2009: Mark Delavan (2000 *The Marriage of Figaro*) as Sir John Falstaff and Veronica Villarroel (2007's *Butterfly*) as Alice Ford square off in Verdi's *Falstaff*. Music Director Antony Walker conducts; Paula Williams (2006 *Tosca*, 2003 *Il barbiere di Siviglia*) directs the Jean-Pierre Ponnelle production from San Francisco Opera that exudes the rustic charm of Elizabethan England.

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December 31, 2009: *Auld Lang Syne*, a classic New Year's Eve with Pittsburgh Opera at Carnegie Music Hall, starring Marianne Cornetti and the Resident Artists, with Antony Walker conducting the orchestra.

January 30 – February 7, 2010: Pittsburgh Opera's Resident Artists perform in Britten's intense, provocative chamber opera *The Rape of Lucretia* in a new Pittsburgh Opera production, at CAPA Theater downtown.

February 26, 2010: Perennial favorite *Cabaret* shows off the versatility of our Resident Artists – leave your opera glasses at home, let your hair down, and enjoy a program of musical theater and novelty songs. At Pittsburgh Opera's Bold New Home in the Strip District. Details to be announced at a later date.

March 20 – 28, 2010: Bizet's *Carmen* returns to Pittsburgh Opera in the guise of mezzo-soprano Kate Aldrich, a former Pittsburgh Opera Resident Artist who is earning rave reviews for the role on world stages. Antony Walker conducts in this classic production from Austin Lyric Opera, which features fast-rising stars Roger Honeywell as Don Jose and Kelly Markgraf as Escamillo, as well as Yali-Marie Williams as Micaëla. Eric Einhorn (2006 *Xerxes*, 2009 *Don Pasquale*) will direct.

April 24 – May 2, 2010: Arriving in spring, *The Marriage of Figaro* lifts our spirits as only Mozart can. Pittsburgher Sari Gruber (2006 *Così fan tutte*) and Resident Artist alumnus Oren Gradus (2005 *Faust*) star as Susanna and Figaro, with Michael Todd Simpson (2006 *Pagliacci*) and Pamela Armstrong (2009 *La bohème*, 2001 *Don Giovanni*) as Count and Countess Almaviva. Zheng Cao (2007 *Madame Butterfly*, 2004 *Julius Caesar*) sings Cherubino; Kevin Glavin (2007 *The Elixir of Love*, 2003 *Il barbiere di Siviglia*) and Joseph Gaines take the comic roles of Dr. Bartolo and Don Basilio, respectively. Kristine McIntyre (2008 *Flight*, 2002 *La Clemenza di Tito*) directs; Gary Thor Wedow conducts (2006 *Xerxes*, 2002 *L'Incoronazione di Poppea*).

May 15, 2010: [Maecenas XXVI](#), consistently listed as one of Pittsburgh's Top 10 Parties. Details to be announced at a later date.

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2009-2010 Season

Eugene Onegin

By Pyotr I. Tchaikovsky

September 26, 29; October 2, 4, 2009

Sung in Russian with English translations projected above the stage.

Pushkin's "novel in verse" inspired Tchaikovsky's grand treatment of a story of love that could never be: the soulful country girl Tatiana and the nobleman Eugene Onegin in Czarist Russia. Such tragedy is rarely so elegant: Tatiana's Letter Scene, beautiful dancing, and a magnificent set make this the season opener not to miss.

Anna Samuil's performance as Tatiana at Salzburg in 2007 (available on DVD) has earned her rave reviews; she stars alongside Metropolitan Opera baritone Dwayne Croft in his signature role as Onegin, with Susanne Mentzer as Madame Larina, Raymond Very as Lensky and Susan Shafer as Filipyevna. Pittsburgh Opera Music Director Antony Walker conducts; Sam Helfrich directs.

Falstaff

Music by Giuseppe Verdi

October 24, 27, 30; November 1, 2009

Sung in Italian with English translations projected above the stage.

The amorous pursuits of Sir John Falstaff are thwarted not once, but twice when he takes on the Merry Wives of Windsor in this Shakespeare classic. Widely considered to be Verdi's masterpiece, ***Falstaff*** is full of hilarity and pratfalls, starring Mark Delavan in the title role, and Veronica Villarroel as his comic foil, Alice Ford, who finally teaches the old man a lesson in love, with a little help from the Merry Wives of Windsor.

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The Rape of Lucretia

By Benjamin Britten

January 30; February 2, 5, 7, 2010

Performed by the Pittsburgh Opera Resident Artists at CAPA Theater

Sung in English with English translations projected above the stage.

"In the forest of my dreams, you have always been the tiger!" Lucretia's story as told by Britten is compelling and tragic, his first "chamber opera." The ancient tale comes to Pittsburgh Opera via its Resident Artists program, in a new production. Britten's captivating score illuminates the story of Lucretia's faithfulness, the injustice visited upon her, and the real historical implications.

Carmen

By Georges Bizet

March 20, 23, 26, 28, 2010

Sung in French with English translations projected above the stage.

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Kate Aldrich, a former Pittsburgh Opera Resident Artist, again graces the stage at the Benedum Center, this time as the unbridled, compulsive Carmen, who must "live free and die free." Caught up in her passion are Don Jose (Roger Honeywell), Escamillo (Kelly Markgraf), and Micaëla (Yali-Marie Williams), a wild passion that can end in no other way but death. Bizet's beloved score, including the famous Habanera and Toreador Song, will be used in its original *Opéra comique* form, with spoken dialogue.

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The Marriage of Figaro

By Wolfgang A. Mozart

April 24, 27, 30; May 2, 2010

Sung in Italian with English translations projected above the stage.

Who can resist the return of love in spring? When Mozart tells the story of Susanna and Figaro's wedding day, love is in the air, behind a door, under a chair, and in everyone's hearts, when all is said and done. Sari Gruber and Oren Gradus headline as Susanna and Figaro, along with Michael Todd Simpson and Pamela Armstrong as the Count and Countess. Zheng Cao is Cherubino; Kevin Glavin and Joseph Gaines appear as Dr. Bartolo and Basilio in this classic farce – with some of the tenderest moments in opera – that romps through an 18th-century ducal palace.
